

Why is this industry an important contributor the nation's manufacturing base?

- More than 56,000 public and private sector facilities
- · 1.1 million jobs
- · \$236 billion in gross, annual sales
- · \$37 billion in annual payroll

How does the size of the recycling industry compare to other major industries?

- Comparable to the auto and truck manufacturing industry
- Significantly larger than mining and waste management and disposal industries
- Wages for workers in the recycling are notably higher than the national average for all industries

What types of businesses make-up the recycling and reuse industry?

- · Long-established sectors like paper and steel making
- New entrepreneurial ventures, such as composting and plastic and rubber product manufacturers
- · Companies that refurbish used electronic appliances, computer equipment and office and home furnishings

What are the largest sectors of the recycling industry?


- Recycled paper and paperboard mills, with 139,375 employees and \$49 billion in annual receipts
- · Steel mills, with 118,544 employees and \$46 billion in annual receipts
- Recycled plastics converters, with 178,700 employees and \$28 billion in annual receipts
- Iron and steel foundries, with 126,313 employees and \$16 billion in annual receipts
