- Lambert has a 5.1 billion annual economic impact on the St. Louis region.
- The airport sits on approximately 2,000 acres of land and with the "W1W" expansion and the addition of a 9000 foot runway well underway, will increase by about 75% by 2006.

Information About Lambert


- Lambert has 87 gates serving 7 major, 11 commuter, 6 on-site air-cargo airlines, and 2 major charter companies on a regular basis.
- Lambert employs over 19,000 people through airlines, vendors, service companies, and the City of St. Louis.
- Of the 19,000, 688 are city employees.
- The airport is owned and operated by the City of St. Louis.

Description

There are 23 departments and over 600 pieces of equipment involved in airport ground operations and maintenance.


