MATCHING GRANTS REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS FY 2003 In 2000, the Massachusetts Toxics Use Reduction Institute (TURI) initiated a new form of matching grant that supported companies' efforts to develop and implement Environmental Management Systems (EMSs).

TURI has funded five EMS matching grant peer mentoring work groups. In these work groups, funded facilities worked either on their own or with the assistance of a consultant to develop and implement an EMS. The host facilities, with TURI assistance, used monthly meetings as a forum to assist industry peers in the development of their own EMS.
