TRASH COLLECTION

- Residential trash will be picked up twice weekly. *East of Highway 5 – Monday and Thursday. West of Highway 5 – Tuesday and Friday.*
- *Trash containers must be placed at the curbside no later than 7:00 a.m.*
- *In the event that your items are not ready by 7:00 a.m. and your street has already been picked up, the Village will be unable to return due to time constraints!*
- In the event a day of collection falls on a legal holiday, trash pickup will resume on the next scheduled trash pickup day.
- All trash shall be bagged, securely covered and maintained in a light weight plastic or metal trash container. Trash container must be a 33 gallon can or smaller.
- Trash will only be picked up at curbside.
- Dog/cat waste must be discarded in a separate bag that is securely sealed and placed in a bag with other trash.

Garbage must meet the above requirements to be picked up!

YARD DEBRIS COLLECTION

- Light yard debris (leaves, twigs, pinecones...) must be bagged securely in a plastic bag, not to exceed 50 pounds. *Any yard debris placed in trash cans that is not bagged cannot be collected.*
- Heavy yard debris (limbs, branches and the like) must be securely tied in bundles not to exceed 4 feet in length. No individual piece shall exceed 6 inches in diameter. Bundle must not exceed 50 pounds in weight or exceed 18" in diameter.
- In the event of a natural disaster (hurricanes, tornadoes, ice/snowstorms, etc.,) please call the Public Services Department for any special instructions.
- Dog/cat waste must not be discarded in yard debris. If animal waste is mixed with yard debris, it will not be picked up.

Yard debris will be picked up Mondays and Fridays from the first week of March through the second week of December. Yard debris will be picked up ONLY on Mondays beginning the third week of December until the last week of February.

Yard Debris must meet the above requirements to be picked up!

POINTS OF INTEREST

- Broken glass, light bulbs, etc. shall be securely wrapped in newspaper to prevent injury to personnel. Please indicate on the package that there is broken glass, etc. Paper or plastic bags will not be considered adequate protection.
- Dead animals, less than 100 pounds, will be collected on a on-call basis. Collection of the animal shall be within ten feet of the road.
- White Goods/Appliances are picked up by appointment only. Please call 295-5021 to set up an appointment.
- Furniture such as couches, TVs and mattresses must be removed by the property owner.
- Construction materials cannot be picked up. It is the responsibility of the property owner or contractor to remove all construction debris.
- Paint cans will be picked up only if the paint and the paint can is completely dried. Paint left in liquid form will not be picked up. The dried paint and can must be placed in a separate bag and placed with regular trash. *Pouring cat litter into the paint will dry the paint up. Unused paint can be donated to the Habitat Store located on Hwy #5. (Information provided by Keep Moore County Beautiful).
